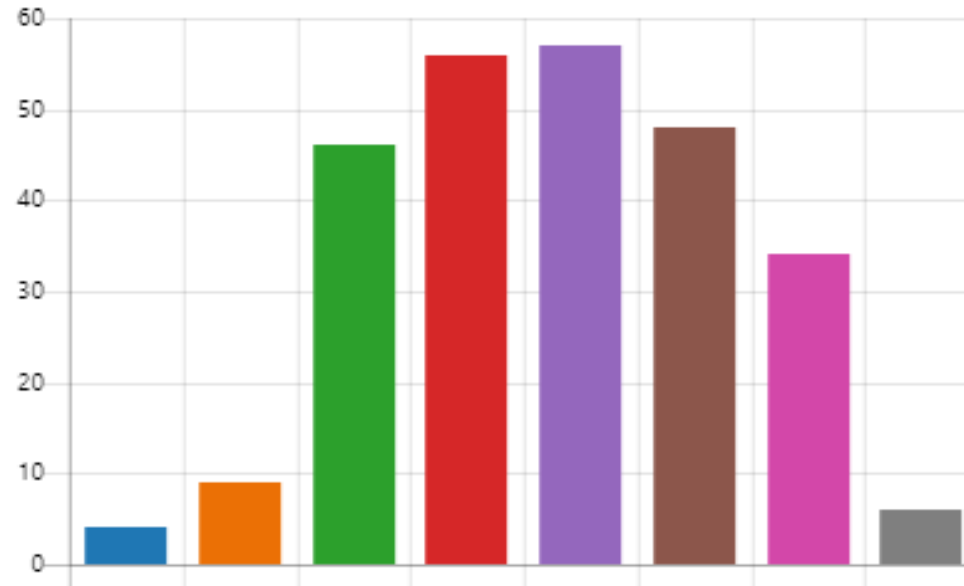
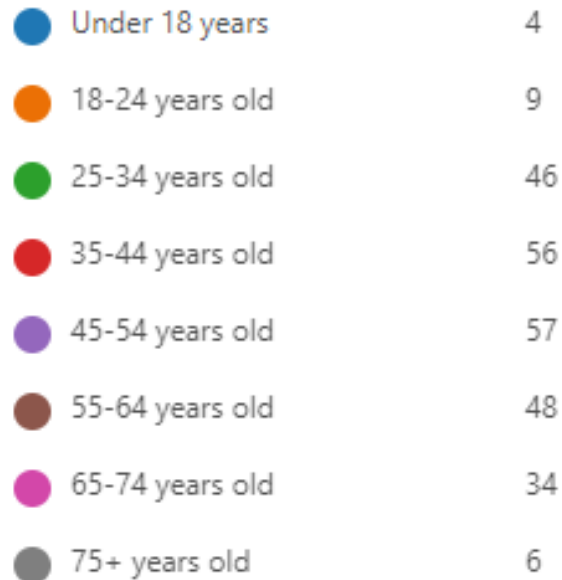
**PUBLIC CONSULTATION – KEY SURVEY
FINDINGS**

Introduction – Responses and Respondents

- Public consultation to seeks views on youth-related ASB both in Gravesend town centre and in local neighbourhoods.
- Survey ran for 4 weeks ending on 17 September 2024.
- 260 responses received – majority of respondents (112) lived in Gravesham, 80 both lived and worked in the Borough and 40 worked locally but lived elsewhere.
- 63% of respondents were female, 31% male and 6% preferred not to say.




Introduction – Responses and Respondents

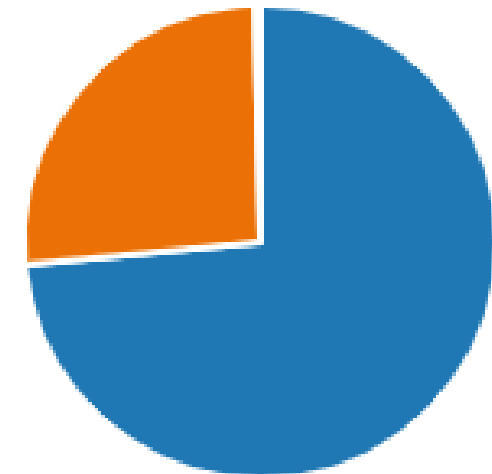
- There was a good cross-section in terms of respondents' age, 76% of respondents were White (English, Welsh or Scottish) and 26 respondents (10%) described themselves as having a disability.



Key Findings

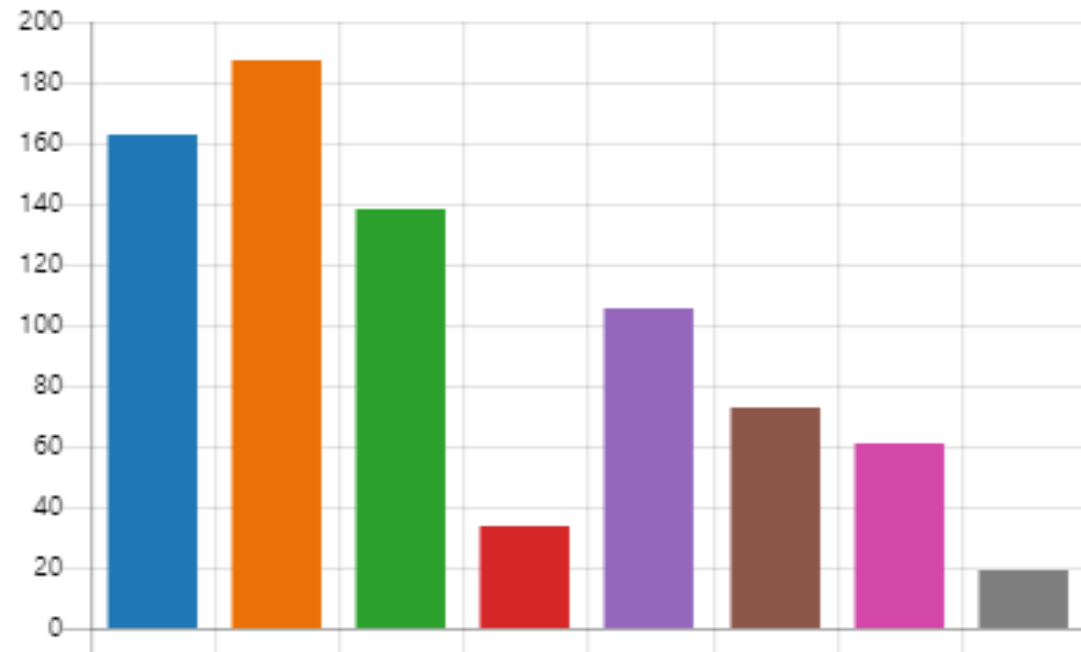
Asked how big a problem they felt that ASB involving young people in the town centre is, on a scale of 1-10 (1= no problem), the average score was 8.2. Compared to the same time last year, 73% (191 respondents) felt youth-related ASB in the town centre had got worse.

Types of youth-related ASB (town centre)

Respondents were asked to select 3 types of ASB they felt were the biggest problem:



Impact of youth-related ASB in the town centre




- 200 (77%) respondents stated that ASB involving young people in the town centre caused them to avoid visiting the area.
- Those who avoided the area were asked to state what times of day they avoided:

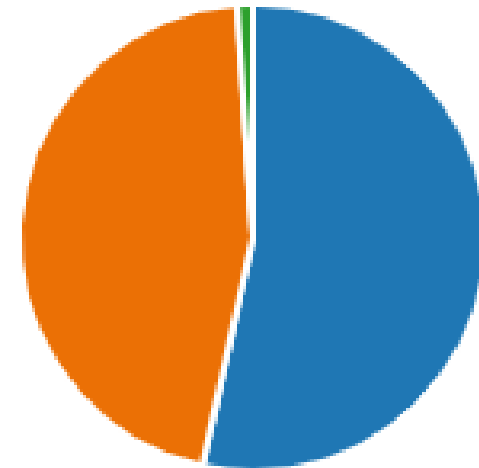
● Mornings	30
● Lunchtime (12.00-2.00pm)	50
● Afternoons (after school hours...)	139
● Evenings/night-time	180



Youth-related ASB – local neighbourhoods

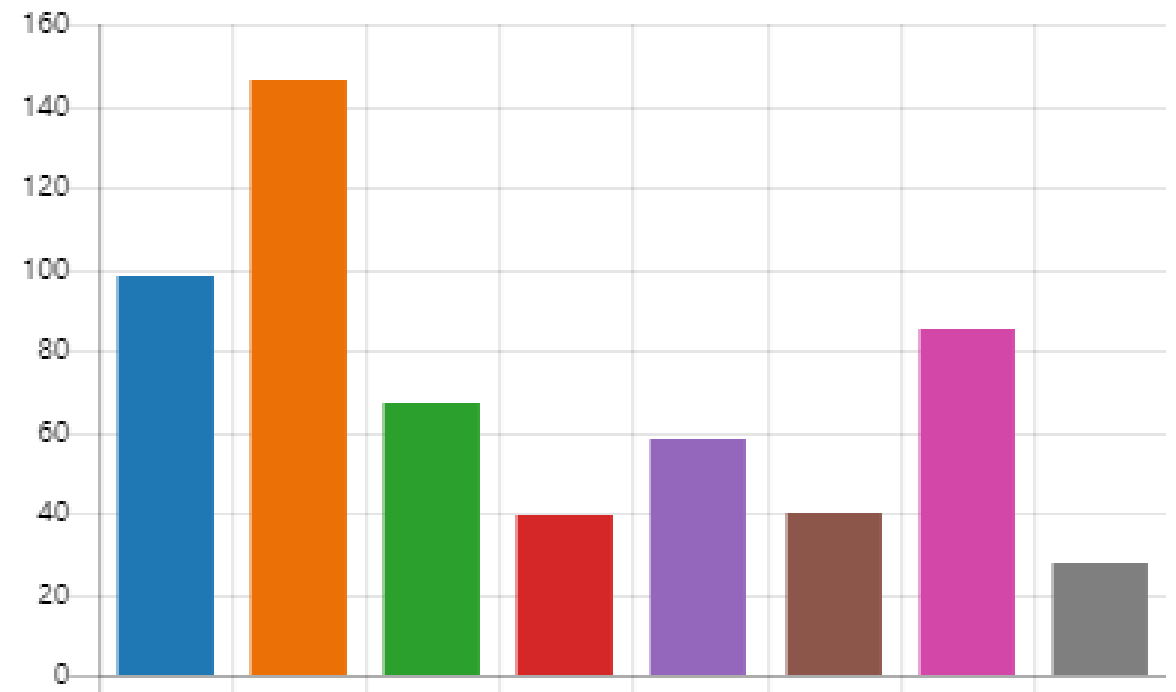
Asked how big a problem they felt that ASB involving young people in their local neighbourhood is, on a scale of 1-10 (1= no problem), the average score was 6.8. Compared to the same time last year, 53% (of 187 respondents) felt youth-related ASB in their neighbourhood had got worse.

Types of youth-related ASB (neighbourhoods)

Respondents were asked to select 3 types of ASB they felt were the biggest problem:



Impact of youth-related ASB (neighbourhoods)

- 90 (48%) respondents stated that ASB involving young people caused them to avoid visiting areas within their local neighbourhood.
- Those who avoided areas were asked to state what times of day they avoided them:

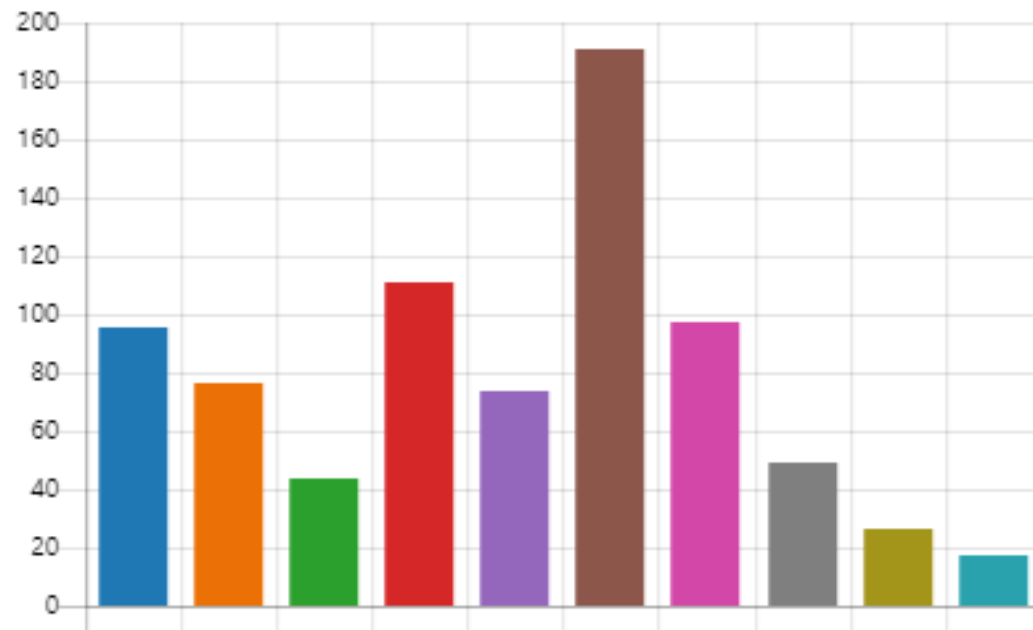
● Mornings	16
● Lunchtime (12.00-2.00pm)	20
● Afternoons (after school hours...)	63
● Evenings/night-time	83



Drivers of youth-related ASB

Respondents were asked to select the top 3 factors that they felt was driving youth-related ASB:

● Boredom	95
● Influence from social media	76
● Peer pressure	44
● Parenting issues/family breakd...	111
● Lack of understanding of/edu...	74
● Lack of respect for others/the ...	191
● Alcohol and/or drug related b...	97
● Lack of facilities	49
● Affordability of facilities/enter...	26
● Other	17
