Topic Albion Quayside compulsory purchase order preliminary steps.

Decision 1. Authority is granted for a compulsory purchase order in principle;
2. The Assistant Director (Governance and Law) is authorised to engage the preferred specialists (Persona Associates) to undertake land referencing of the Albion Quayside sites, and if necessary to issue formal statutory requisitions.

Reasons for the decision

- 1. Regeneration of the Canal Basin is an important objective for the Council and the use of powers of compulsory purchase will be necessary to achieve this aim;
- 2. The land referencing exercise is underwritten by a third party and is accordingly cost neutral to the Council.
