Prevention of crime and disorder	Yes	<p>McDonalds at New Road Gravesend has a history of crime and disorder offences, this will filter through to the Asda McDonalds if it is given a 24 hour licence.</p> <p>Crime figures recorded by Kent Police for incidents reported between January 2016 and July 2018. Show that the 10 worst locations across Kent where incidents that have taken place are either inside or immediately outside McDonald restaurants</p> <p>McDonalds at New Road Gravesend was listed at no.4 (1st being the worst) with 332 crimes recorded.</p> <p>Report also suggested that ALL locations with 24 hour openings seemed to experience a high number of incidents that were serious enough for the police to be called.</p> <p>Crime and ASB recorded in Pelham Ward from November 2017 to October 2018 is 1837 of which 374 were Anti-social behaviour incidents</p>

Public safety	Yes	<p>Kent Poilice records show for the period July 2018 to June 2019, 269 incidents within the close vicinity of New Road McDonalds, of which 36 were ASB, 35 were public order offences and 87 violent offences.</p> <p>Figures for Thames Way very close to Asda Carpark, between July 2018 and June2019 show 22 incidents</p> <p>2 of the incidents were Anti Social Behaviour, 7 of the incidents were violent crimes and 5 were public order offences.</p> <p>This is the current situation and there is concern 24 Hour opening of McDonalds will lead to an increase in these crime figures.</p>
Prevention of public nuisance	Yes	<p>Asda car park has a history of ASB, the 24 hour McDonald opening would increase Anti-social behaviour in the area. Asda carpark, is used by nuisance vehicles racing and causing noise disturbance. This has resulted in the second floor carpark being shut at night and the problem now has moved to the outside carpark area</p> <p>24 hour opening will give the opportunity for clientele to stay in the area longer then they currently do, which could then potentially increase the level of disturbance caused.</p>
