4. Details of association of the above premises with serious crime, serious disorder or both:

At approximately 03:07 on Saturday 2nd October 2021 police received a report of an alleged assault that had occurred outside of the Kings Head Sport Bar, King Street in Gravesend. CCTV has confirmed that a violent disturbance had occurred directly outside the premises at approximately 03:00 and involved customers from the venue. The assault involved a male victim receiving numerous punches to the head resulting in substantial facial injuries likely to require corrective surgery. The level of injuries received by the victim are consistent with a grievous bodily harm assault.

At this stage the suspect(s) remain outstanding and this continues to be an active investigation for an offence of S.18 GBH with intent.

It is suspected that at the time of the incident the premises were employing door supervisor(s) that were not SIA registered staff.

Notes for guidance:

- conduct that amounts to one or more criminal offences for which a person who has attained the age of eighteen and has no previous convictions could reasonably be expected to be sentenced to imprisonment for a term of three years or more; or
- conduct that amounts to one or more criminal offences and involves the use of violence, results in substantial financial gain or is conduct by a large number of persons in pursuit of a common purpose.

Serious disorder is not defined in legislation, and so bears its ordinary English meaning.
