**Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions**



Condition 1 – took effect 24 November 2005

**No supply of alcohol may be made under this licence:-**

- (a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of it or
- (b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his/her personal licence is suspended.

**Every retail sale or supply of alcohol made under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.**

Condition 9 – took effect 1 October 2014

- (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol
- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either
  - (a) a holographic mark, or
  - (b) an ultraviolet feature

Condition 11 – took effect 28 May 2014

- (1) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price, which is less than the permitted price.
- (2) For the purpose of the condition set out in paragraph 1:-
  - (a) “duty” is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979(6);
  - (b) “permitted price” is the price found by applying the formula:-  $P = D + (D \times V)$  where:-
    - (i) P is the permitted price,
    - (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
    - (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
  - (c) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence:-
    - (i) the holder of the premises licence
    - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
    - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

- (d) **“relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and**
- (e) **“value added tax” means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994(7)**
- (3) Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph (2) would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.**
- (4) (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph (2) on a day (“the first day”) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (“the second day”) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.**
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.**

#### **Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating schedule**

1. CCTV must be installed to the satisfaction of the Police and Local Authority in accordance with the CCTV code of practice issued by the Information Commissioner’s Office. Recordings are to be maintained for at least 31 days. If the equipment fails the Police and the Council must be informed as soon as possible and immediate steps will be taken to put the equipment back into service.
2. At all times when the premises are open and trading, there must be at least one person who is trained in the use of the CCTV equipment and is able to obtain recordings directly from the system. Recordings are to be given to the Police or authorised person upon request.
3. All staff working on the premises will be fully trained to ensure they understand and adhere to the law relating to the sale / supply of alcohol. This training is to be documented and recorded.
4. At all times the Designated Premises Supervisor or a personal licence holder must be present to authorise the sale / supply of alcohol.
5. All alcohol is to be displayed on suitable shelving as indicated on the plan and NOT on the floor.
6. At no time is alcohol to be displayed near to the entrance or exit doors.
7. All surplus supplies of alcohol are to be stored in a locked stockroom.
8. No ID No Sale notices are to be displayed clearly on the tills.
9. These premises will ensure that any person appearing to be under 25 years of age and attempting to purchase alcohol will be asked to provide identification and proof of age. Proof of age accepted would either be new photo driving licence, valid UK passport, Official HM Armed forces ID or a recognised ID card containing the official PASS logo.

**Annex 3 – Conditions attached after a hearing by the  
licensing authority**



1. A register of refusals of alcohol will be maintained at the premises. The register shall be examined on a regular basis by the duty manager/ DPS and the date and time of each examination will be endorsed in the register. The register will be made available for inspection by the Police and other responsible authority
2. An incident register will be maintained at the premises and will be made available for inspection by the Police and other responsible authority. All incidents of a criminal matter will be reported to the police and full details entered into the register.
3. No beer, lager, cider, perry or spirit mixer above 7.5% will be sold at the premises.
4. A 'clear glazing' policy for the window at the front of the shop shall be kept above 1 metre and below 2 meters (measured from the shop floor) so staff have an unobstructed view of the area outside the front of the premises through the glass looking into the street. The exception to this shall be the display of notices required by law and any required as a condition of this licence.
