Consideration of the Licensing objectives has been taken into consideration. Consultation with both Licensing and Police Licensing has taken place, prior to submitting this application. A site meeting also took place between the applicant and Police Licensing on the 5th, January 2024, where a number of conditions were agreed and are as stated in the Licensing objective boxes below.

Convenience Store opening hours and retail sale of alcohol (off sales only) Monday to Sunday, 0800 hours to 0000 hours.

Community Hall opening hours and retail sale of alcohol (on sales only) Monday to Sunday, 0800 hours to 0200 hours.

**b) The prevention of crime and disorder**

CCTV that lasts 31 days, that it is provided to police upon reasonable request and that there is a DPS or appointed person on site at all times that has the ability to operate the CCTV if required.

Should the CCTV become faulty, police licensing to be notified.

**c) Public safety**

A risk assessment will be carried out and if so required SIA door staff may be employed at certain times throughout the operating hours, where so required.

The premises will be maintained in a safe manner at all times

All exits will be kept unobstructed, easy to open and clearly signed
